Another important part of his life was the Berwyn Eagles He was so devoted to this organization and made so many life-long friends among its members. Even though he worked nights most of his younger life, he still found time to become a Trustee and never missed an Eagles' event. That included out-of-town bowling tournaments each Spring (he bowled on my father's team) and the numerous holiday dances. Later he became very involved with REAC and worked the weekly bingo nights where we would get to see each other and "catch up" every Wednesday. All through my life Uncle Jack never missed a dance recital, school program, or graduation of mine. I have so many treasured memories of him. There are few people in this world as generous as he was with his time and talents. He was very special to me.
