Thomas Charles Steinle passed away on Saturday April 23rd, after a prolonged battle with Acute Myeloid Leukemia.

Tom was strong, spiritually, mentally, and physically; he lived his life with a sense of duty and purpose. Tom was a master craftsman in many areas; whether with glass, metal or wood. He was a life-long member of the Carpenters Union, working on many of Chicago's major skyscrapers and hospitals which will shine for decades in the Chicago skyline. More recently, he became a City of Chicago employee in 2004, driving every vehicle imaginable with ease.

Tom loved his friends and was beloved in his neighborhood. He especially enjoyed hosting Bear's games, Christmas parties, and attending his annual golf outing with this close-knit group of men.
